



Supplies required **before** entering the classroom:

- A folder in which to keep the printed booklets given by the teacher
- A complete pencil case

Subjects and skilled taught (5th year transition):

- Human societies from the start of the Interwar Period to the end of the Cold War.
- To develop a critical mind about representations and traces of the past (→ all skills are detailed in the FWB school programs)

Assessments to ensure successful completion of the course:

- Maintain one's course notes in order (= 10 % of the December exam).
- Successfully piece together well-argued answer to the research questions given by the teacher thanks to the course notes.
- Successfully analyse documents and relate them to the course material.
- Successfully pass the external exam scheduled by the FWB (the CESS).
- (optional) Give a good oral presentation on a given historical topic.

Rules in class

- The teacher decides where students sit.
- It is **forbidden** to...
 1. ...**make too much noise**,
 2. ...**be violent** (even 'in jest' /'just for laughs') and
 3. ...**"fidget" restlessly** (= to move around the classroom without permission, to turn around in one's chair, to stand behind one's bench, etc.)
- If the teacher notices a transgression, he will raise a 'card' to remind the student of the offense. Students who do not correct their behaviour at this point will be sentenced according to the provisions given in the Internal Regulation Manual (= R.O.I.).
